EMERGENCY SERVICES CURRICULUM



The first step in becoming active in CAP's Emergency Services activities is to obtain your General Emergency Services (GES) qualification. GES is a pre-requisite for any activity in CAP. Listed below are the steps which must be completed to obtain the GES qualification:

1. Posses a valid CAP ID card.
2. Obtain the proper CAP uniform (Refer to CAPR 39-1).
3. Review the Cadet Protection Program video presentation.
4. Complete Level 1 training. (Offered online from the CAP National website level2.cap.gov/index.cfm?nodeID=6564).
5. Review CAP Regulation CAPR 60-3 (Available from the CAP National Website http://level2.cap.gov/visitors/member_services/publications/indexes_regulations_and_manuals.cfm).
6. Pass the CAPT 116, Parts 1 & 2, online Emergency Services Questionnaire (http://www.cap.gov/visitors/members/operations/operations_training/ges_requirement).
7. Pass the CAPT 117 Part 1 Emergency Services Continuing Education online questionnaire.
8. Complete Radio Operator (ROB) training.
9. Upload your digital picture on the eServices website (www.capnhq.gov/default.aspx).
10. Print your CAP 101 (Specialty Qualification Training Record) card.

Completion of GES qualifies a member to move onto any area of CAP Emergency Services specialties; such as Urban Direction Finding, Ground Team, Mission Scanner, etc. For more information on the Emergency Services opportunities in CAP, consult the National website www.cap.gov/visitors/members/operation .
